Behavioral Health Services

Talking with a professional counselor about personal addictions, challenges and behaviors can strengthen relationships, reduce stress and prevent problems from escalating out of control.

Programs include:

- Individual, Group and Family Mental Health Therapy
- At Ease (*trauma treatment and therapeutic support for active military, veterans and their loved ones*)
